



Jeremy Collins is a former Principal Dancer of the American Ballet Theatre and Principal Guest Artist with the San Francisco Ballet and New York City Ballet. Jeremy began his ballet training at the age of ten at the Northampton School of Ballet in Northampton, MA under the tutelage of his mother Gail. At sixteen, he began studying at the School of American Ballet in New York City. He joined the corps de ballet of American Ballet Theatre in 1985. He was appointed Soloist in 1989 and Principal Dancer in 1992. Jeremy has performed the lead role in Coppelia, Cinderella, Don Quixote, Giselle, La Bayadere, Romeo and Juliet, The Sleeping Beauty, Swan Lake, Theme and Variations, Violin Concerto, and many others. Jeremy has also been a guest artist with Stars of the American Ballet and Stars of the New York City Ballet. Jeremy's image was used to publicize the Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta GA in 1996.

Jeremy graduated High School from Professional Children's School in New York City. He is a graduate of Indiana University School of Music and University of Massachusetts Medical School. He completed his post graduate medical training in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation with specialized fellowship training in Interventional Spine and Pain Management at Temple University Hospital in Philadelphia, PA.
